<i><u>The following must be sent to the school prior to your acceptance:</u> Complete the Application for Admissions</i>	- <u>http://app.aviator.edu/</u> be sure to pay the application fee
□ Proof of Age and Citizenship	-Birth Certificate and Driver's License or Passport - color copies
□ Proof of Funds	-You will need to provide proof of funds to the embassy to cover amount indicated on the I-20. When you arrive at the school you will need to submit one-third of your program expenses.

Aviator College will submit your academic transcripts for evaluation if an application and deposit payment have been made. Prior to this being completed the student must submit these documents to an approved third party for an equivalency evaluation. Contact your admissions representative for an approved agency list. *Transcripts MUST BE to Aviator College no less than 30 days prior to your start if a translation is not needed and 60 days prior to start if translation is needed. After those times evaluation fees will increase and Aviator is not responsible if your documents are deemed unacceptable.*

□ Highest Level of Ed	-Official College Transcripts including ACE, Smart or other submitted for transfer credit and/or entrance test exemption.
Entrance Test	-SAT: Writing = 440, Reading = 440, Math = 440 acceptable, 250 preferred. -ACT: English = 17, Reading = 18, Math 19 acceptable, 23 preferred -PERT (only available in Florida): English 99, Reading 104 and Math 123
English Proficiency/ICAO Requirement	-You will need to send us 1 of the following: English as a first language OR 3 year's post-secondary study in English (official and evaluated school transcripts) OR accepted test of English (TOEFL, IELTS, TOEIC- requires a 4 part test). To begin flight training, ICAO Level 4 (or higher) is required as shown by certificate of an approved ICAO English Proficiency Test OR as shown on the Pilot License.
English Proficiency must be submitted prior to entry. ICAO testing can be administered at Aviator.	

ONCE ALL DOCUMENTS ARE RECEIVED AND VERIFIED AN ACCEPTANCE LETTER WITH THE I-20 WILL BE SENT

Once you receive your I-20 you will then need to make an appointment with your local USA Embassy.	
□ SEVIS	-You will need to go online and register at <u>www.fmjfee.com</u> before you Embassy appointment.
	- Hold a F1 or M1 VISA acceptable to the United States and appropriate for specified training
□ FAA Documents	-Gain and submit a 1 st class FAA Medical and Student Pilot Certificate prior to beginning program. You can locate an examiner in your area at, <u>http://www.faa.gov/pilots/amelocator/</u>
□Foreign License	-Submit currently held Pilot's license(s) to the FAA 8-12 weeks before start date -Follow steps at: <u>http://www.aviator.edu/home/international-students/faa-application.aspx</u>

You will need to produce the FAA Letter of Authenticity in order to enter flight training at the advanced level. Students can elect to retake the rating under the FAA standards. Please discuss with your admissions representative about your preference.

You are required to register for all applicable training courses: Initial, Multi and Instrument. You will have to pay \$130 per each training request, \$390 total. Upon arrival you will have to be fingerprinted, a cost of \$99. If you are not approved for fingerprinting upon arrival your training may be delayed.
